
Mental Health Week







Parents and carers of children with disabilities can stay up to date with the support available to them thanks to the Council's new Children and Young People's Disability Register.

People on the register will be able to access information about a range of services, local activities and events, as well as help to influence and shape future services.

To sign up to the register, each child must:

- Have a learning difficulty, mental health, medical condition or a physical disability
- · Be 0 to 25 years old
- · Live in the Borough of Stockton-on-Tees



Animal Care




Bird food tasting
